This is a 6 night camp, at Camp Olave, located on the BC Sunshine Coast. On Sunday, July 15th the girls accompanied by a parent will come as foot passengers on the 12:05 pm ferry from Horseshoe Bay. Girls must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. Please arrive 45 minutes early. Parking is available at Horseshoe Bay. They will be met at the Langdale Ferry Terminal at:12:45 pm and transported by bus to Camp Olave. Parents will take the 1:10 pm return ferry from Langdale to Horseshoe Bay. On Saturday, July 21st the girls will go by bus from the camp to Langdale Ferry Terminal to meet their parents who will come over on the 10:50 am ferry from Horseshoe Bay. Please arrive 45 minutes early. Parents and girls will return to Horseshoe Bay on the 11:55 am ferry from Langdale. During the camp girls will be assigned to various residential sites and will sleep in bunks. Activities at the camp will include painting, singing, drama, dancing as well as swimming, archery, fitness circuit, low ropes, camp cooking and a possible field trip for the Pathfinders.

Brief description of facility/site: Camp Olave is a large waterfront camp consisting of 15 sites owned and operated by the Girl Guides of Canada. Campers take a 40 minute ferry ride as foot passengers from Horseshoe Bay in West Vancouver to Langdale on the Sunshine Coast. The camp is a 30 minute bus ride from the Langdale Ferry Depot.

Number of children/youth expected: 100 The minimum supervision ratios will be: 5:1

Supervision will be provided as follows: (Guiders – please briefly explain how supervision will be managed.)
Girls will be camping at 5 sites. Each site will have a site coordinator, an assistant coordinator who may double as a first aider, a quartermaster, and patrol Guiders to make up the required ratio. Girls will be accompanied by a leader to their various activities. A buddy system will be in effect and girls will not be allowed to leave their site unless accompanied by an adult.
